1. Save \$1.85 when you withdraw cash from ATMs.

Once you reach your account's fee-free transaction limit, withdrawals cost 65c at our ATMs instead of \$2.50 over the counter.¹ And you can use ATMs whenever it suits you, day or night. It's easy. It's convenient.

There are over 1500 Westpac, Bank of Melbourne and Challenge Bank ATMs all around the country. Use them and you won't pay fees for using other banks' ATMs.



2. Pay by EFTPOS and get cash out for free.

At many retail outlets throughout Australia, you can pay by EFTPOS and withdraw cash at the same time. This counts as one withdrawal and will help you avoid paying transaction fees for excess withdrawals.¹

3. Save 60% when you pay your credit card by phone.

4. See and print previous statements for free with Internet Banking.
