The Wanderings of a Prestonian Lecturer

The Prestonian Lecture in its present form dates from 1924 and allows the Lecturer chosen to deliver a paper upon a masonic subject of his own choice. The Lecture has to be Educational, Informative and Interesting, my choice of Lecture was "Women and Freemasonry". When I was appointed I didn't realise how popular the lecture would become, and after being informed that the three official deliveries of the Lecture would be held at The Connaught Army and Navy Lodge No.4323 (London) The West Kent Masters Lodge No.5778 (West Kent)

The Antient and Loyal Lodge No.9762 (West Lancashire) I thought that I would receive about 15 other invitations to deliver my talk, I was shattered that by the end of the year I had delivered it a total of 69 times to the four quarters of the globe. Starting in January I visited Auckland (The District Grand Lodge of North Island New Zealand), and spoke at the Remuera Lodge No 1710, where over 130 ladies, brethren and non masons heard sat down to a delightful buffet after hearing the talk. Considering that masonry was closed down for their summer and it was the height of their holiday season, everyone was delighted at such a large attendance. In Christchurch (The District Grand Lodge of South Island New Zealand), I received an equally attentive audience, no ladies present this time, but brethren from the four Constitutions, England, Ireland, Scotland and the Grand Lodge of New Zealand. This was the pattern of my lecturing, whenever I was going overseas I offered my services to the District or Province where I was visiting or holidaying so I was able to talk in Cyprus, Barbados, Guyana, Mumbai (or Bombay as I knew it) Jersey and Guernsey. Everywhere I, and my wife, when she was accompanying me were received with tremendous hospitality and goodwill, really unforgettable.

The Lodges such as the Albion Lodge No. 196 Barbados who petitioned Grand Lodge to alter the qualification of a Freemason from "freeborn" to being a free man to allow men being born into slavery to be made masons and many more.

My visits to Lodges on the mainland were just as memorable the three official lectures, where the Lodges pulled out every stop to make my visit a memorable one. The 250th Anniversary meeting of the Social Lodge No 93 in Norfolk, where I felt I was carrying coals to Newcastle, as there is a Lodge in Norwich which performs a demonstration of the ceremony where Elizabeth St Leger is made a mason at her fathers house in Ireland. The meeting of the West Kent Provincial Grand Stewards Lodge No 8565, where not only ladies and non masons were present, but the PGM R W Bro Jonathan Winpenny presented me with a certificate to celebrate my having survived for 50 years as a mason. It was nice to have my wife present as she has been so supportive over the last 52 years. The Lodges and Chapters I visited are too numerous to list but the Past Masters Lodges in East Kent, Surrey, Middlesex. Sussex, Hampshire & Isle of Wight, Dorset, Devon, Wiltshire, Lancashire, Jersey and Guernsey must be mentioned.

One of the perks that the Prestonian Lecturer has is that he can print a copy of his Lecture and is allowed to the sell the publication for a Charity of the Lecturers choice, my choice of charities were The District Grand Lodge of Guyana Flood Relief Fund and London Youth., apart from that when overseas I donated any money I raised to the District Charity Fund, so that I could support local masonry in the various Distr1cts that I visited.. During my year I raised over £10,000 and donated £2,000 to London Youth and £8,600 to the various Districts, the bulk of which went to the District Grand Lodge of Guyana Flood Relief Fund.

Finally a few statistics I have now delivered the lecture "Women and Freemasonry" 85 times, with a few more to come, over 4,700 people have heard me of whom almost a 1,000 were ladies and non masons, I haven't included my wife who has heard it over 25 times. I would like to thank all of those who purchased 2,000 copies of my lecture and all the brethren who generously donated money to my chosen charities and particularly all the Lodge Secretaries who organised the meetings and all of those who acted as my host at all these meetings. **GWSD**


