### Why was I deleted?

The GFN data filing system allows three months period before it removes the information of those members who have not logged on for 90 days. If that is the case in your situation, your data has been

purged and you have to register again. Fill out the Application Form as you did the first time. Your second registration may take a little while longer to process. Please note how you fill in the form things like capital letters.

By the way, "Logging-on" (once in 90 days) entails only the following: The bare minimum is that you enter your User Name and Password and log-off. That's it. That is enough to satisfy the GFN Administrative System to mark you as "active". It takes less than a minute.

There are plenty of staff to help with any problems you have. **Communicate with them**.

There is also a FAQ (FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS) section. Have a look. Most problems are covered.

# Re Grand Lodge of Alabama

Greetings Bro. Brian,

This information has been flowing around the web recently as a result of a faction trying to rally support against our present Governor Bob Riley. Gov. Riley is a MM in the Grand Lodge of Alabama. He is also a KCCH in Scottish Rite.

To the question at hand.

This information is incorrect. Did it happen in 1876, yes? Did it come up? again in 1970, it appears so. Is it still policy, no? What more can I say. I have attached a current copy of the Grand Lodge of Alabama Code for you to read if you wish.

The Edicts dealing with membership are:

Article 6-Section7:

No subordinate Lodge shall proceed to confer any or either of the degrees of Masonry upon any person who is not a man, free-born, of the age of Twenty-one years or upward, of good reputation, of sufficient natural and Intellectual endowment, with an estate, office, trade or occupation, or some Other obvious source of honest subsistence from which he may be able to spare something for works of charity and for maintaining the ancient dignity and ability of the Masonic Institution. If the petitioner be physically defective by reason of deformity or being maimed, his eligibility shall be determined by the Lodge to which he has applied, and if determined favourably to the petitioner, he shall be eligible to receive the degrees of Masonry when the action of the Lodge has been approved by the District Lecturer or Assistant Lecturer of that district in writing. The authorization will be reported to the Grand Secretary using a ispensation form supplied by the Grand Lodge.

## Article 6-Section 10:

No person shall be initiated, passed or raised in any Lodge, or admitted to membership therein without the unanimous consent of the members present, nor shall any Lodge require any of its members to assign his or their reasons for voting against any person who may apply for membership or initiation

therein.

There are those who would say that the requirement to be "freeborn" is our way of excluding African American petitioners. This is not the way it was explained to me. I was told that the word "freeborn" is in reference to a man being free to think and act for himself. And to not being indebted to someone as a servant. This would have included those in servitude/bondage in England, Scotland, and Ireland in the 1700's and before.Also, it has been stated that in our Obligation we use the word "nigger/negro" in place of the word "clandestine". This is not correct and it is not the "adopted work" in Alabama. Our "work" is exemplified each year at our Annual Communication in November. I have never seen or heard the "n" word used.

I know that you only asked a simple question. And the straight answer is No.

I could of course go on and relate a recent post from a member of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Alabama where it was stated that at this time they do not want to pursue recognition and reasons for that, but I would only be speaking second hand info read on a PHA egroup.

I want to thank you for asking me about this information before publishing the Newsletter.

I hope that I have explained how my Grand Lodge does not stand by what was said many, many years ago. We all have fallen and come short, but we all learn over time and make amends. And in the future, I feel all will be changed for the better and recognition will be done.

# Scottish visit

On Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October, Peter Evans, Mike Dyer and Rick Smale arrived at my house at 8.00 am to make a GFN 'UK Get-Together' trip to Scotland . We proceeded by car to Stanstead Airport, via the M25 and M11, arriving in about an hour for our check-in at 11.00 am. We were, by now, looking forward to a 'fry up' breakfast.

To our dismay the queue for the security check was horrendously long; comprising about 500 people. Eventually we reached security only to be told no lighters, toothpaste, or any liquids were permitted! Having thrown our lighters into a bag with about a thousand others we were able to proceed to check in for our flight to Glasgow. By this time we were nearing our flight time, so the prospect of breakfast was receding.

We boarded the plane looking forward to food during the flight, but nothing substantial was on offer. On arrival at Glasgow Airport, after an hour's flight, we caught a bus to Glasgow Central Station to meet Graham Elms. Finding his train was not due until 3.00pm and so having an hour to waste, we had a beer at a pub outside the station. Hunger pains were now intensifying so we had Cornish pasties on the station concourse.

Graham arrived only a little late but enough to cause missing the train to Prestwick. Eventually, half hour later, we boarded the train for another 50 min journey. At Prestwick Town station we were met by Andrew Scott who took us to our hotel. He remarked, "I will pick you up in 1 hr to take you to Lodge Tarbolton (Kilwinning)", so again prospects of food diminished. By the time we had drunk a quick cup of tea and changed, Andrew was back. "Never mind" we thought, "we will eat at the meeting". David Hamilton and David Nesbitt, from Northern Ireland, were at the hotel earlier in the day and they told us they had two dinners each. Lucky them!

We proceeded to Tarbolton Lodge and were made to wait outside the door whilst the Lodge was opened. We then formed a deputation of members of the GFN and Crayford Lodge and entered to applause from the assembled brethren.

The members of Tarbolton carried out a very fine Raising. Being from the English Constitution we found the ceremony a somewhat different, and rather dramatic in parts.

After the work was completed we were taken to the dining area where a fine selection of snacks and sandwiches was laid out. "At last!", we thought. We had just made a start on the refreshments, when we were informed the Lodge's Robert Burns Museum was open for our perusal. This contained a fine display of Lodge material dating back to 1700, some of which directly related to Robert Burns, a Past Depute Master of the Lodge. As memento of our visit, I gave the Curator of the Museum a GFN Car Sticker which he was very pleased to receive and placed in a display cabinet in a conspicuous position.

Unfortunately on our return to the dining area the food had been cleared away! However, the WM did keep us well supplied with whisky until midnight, at which point we left. We returned to our hotel tired, but very impressed with our welcome and the ceremony we had witnessed.

Next morning we were up at 6.00 am to catch our flight home from Glasgow airport, finally arriving at Dartford at 1.00pm.
