Star Trek: Enterprise cancelled

Star Trek: Enterprise," the latest incarnation of one of the most storied franchises in televised science-fiction history, will end its four-season run in May, broadcaster UPN said Wednesday. UPN said the last episode would air Friday, May 13. The series generated 98 episodes over its run, although it struggled in the ratings.

The original 1960s "Star Trek" series gave rise to generations of fans who eagerly took in movies, books, and TV spinoffs like "Star Trek: The Next Generation," "Star Trek: Deep Space Nine" and "Star Trek: Voyager." Star Trek: Enterprise" was positioned as a prequel to the original "Star Trek." It starred Scott Bakula and premiered in September 2001.





60 years ago – a defining moment

Before the Marines landed, there was already trouble. The tiny island was shrouded in smoke and dust from a massive three-day naval barrage that preceded the assault, the longest and heaviest bombardment of the entire Pacific war. Then, when the Marines came ashore at Iwo Jima, they faced a hell they were not prepared for. As they leaped from their landing craft, the Americans sank in the ash and cinders of the beaches. Even their amphibious vehicles got bogged down. It wasn't known that a 21,000-man force of fanatical adversaries were holed up in a maze of caves, tunnels, crevices, carefully camouflaged pillboxes, and bombproof underground hideouts. The Japanese had been ordered to hold their fire after the landings so their positions would not be given away. The Japanese resistance was more determined and devastating than anything the Americans could have imagined. Inch by painful inch, US Marines worked their way up Iwo Jima's high volcanic-ash terraces. Before the final assault on Mt. Suribachi began, a folded flag was given to the commander of the platoon assigned to the job. The flag went up when it seemed there were no enemy troops around. There were cheers and tears and, offshore, boats sounded their whistles. Three hours after the original flag went up and after a still unexpected resistance, it was replaced by a larger one brought ashore from a tank landing ship. Associated Press photographer Joe Rosenthal took the celebrated photo which became a model for the US Marine Corps War Memorial at Arlington, Virginia. The historic photograph on February 23, 1945 marks a defining moment in the history of World War II. You know the photo, of course - it's seared in our memories, for, as the editors of "US Camera Magazine" noted, "In that moment, Rosenthal's camera recorded the soul of a nation."


World marks Auschwitz liberation

Holocaust survivors and world leaders have held an emotional ceremony in Poland, 60 years after the liberation of the Nazis' Auschwitz death camp.

The Nazi regime murdered six million Jews and many others during what became known as the Holocaust. Auschwitz, the largest of the Nazi camps, where 1.1 million people died, was liberated by the advancing Soviet army on 27 January 1945.

Battlestar Galactica, the re-versioned vision, as I like to call it has surprised a lot of people; so much so that it has managed to do two things. One, it has helped propel the Sci-Fi channel to new heights, it has garnered more of an audience than ENTERPRISE ever did, and it has managed to do something it's predecessor never managed to do; achieve a second season.

Galactica to See 20 Episodes In Second Season

The series got its green light from Sci-Fi Channel last week after airing just five episodes of the series on Friday night. The show is pulling in more than 3 million viewers each week, topping the numbers generated by "Stargate SG-1" and "Stargate: Atlantis," both of which also are seeing very high numbers. All three shows are performing better than the now-cancelled "Star Trek: Enterprise" on UPN, despite being on a cable channel.

Since premiering in the United States, it has helped Sci-Fi Channel carry Friday nights, and has been one of the top 25 cable programs each week. It currently is Sci-Fi Channel's highest-rated program.

Battlestar Galactica'' airs Fridays at 10 p.m. ET on Sci-Fi Channel. It follows "Stargate SG-1" at 8 p.m. and "Stargate: Atlantis" at 9 p.m
