CURRENT RESEARCH PROJECTS:

I am polishing manuscripts of the above papers for submission to several different periodicals, while writing my major book, Adam's Descendants: Enlightenment Anthropology, a detailed discussion of the emerging anthropology that was created by several Enlightenment figures. It opens with Georges de Buffon's human prototype and epigenist earth history and will conclude with Johann Gottfried Herder's biological rhetoric in the *Ideen*. This book will also contain information from the 200 unpublished letters that I found during my dissertation research on Petrus Camper. On the side I am slowly translating Camper texts from Dutch into English, with a Dutch (Frisian) colleague who is translating Camper texts from Latin into English. We want to publish this book in the United States, calling it *Empiricism and Natural Philosophy by Petrus* Camper, translated into English by Jacob van Sluis, Ph.D. and Miriam Claude Meijer, Ph.D. Another side project, a historical fiction book for teenage girls entitled An Ethical Heroine: Nancy Blanche Jenison, M.D., was supported with a grant from the Ethical Society. I did all the pre-press work for my borther's book, TEN STEPS to Control Diabetes, and am therefore professionally skilled in desktop publishing, including computer graphics for print as well as the Web.
