**Final Project: Midwife's Apprentice**

**Directions:** For your final project for the Midwife's Apprentice, you will demonstrate your knowledge of the novel, literary terms, writing, and creativity. You must pick **three scenes** from the novel that you feel are important, illustrate the scenes in some way (options are listed below), write a **paragraph for each scene** explaining why the scene is important to the novel and what literary devices (terms) the author uses in that scene. You will have a **total of three paragraphs**.

**Illustration Options:**

- Illuminated Manuscript
- Diorama (3-dimensional model of the scene)
- Children's Book
- Illustrated Diary (from the point of view of one character in the novel)

**Requirements:**

**Ø Illustrated Scenes**

- Must include three important scenes from the novel. These scenes must be spaced out over the novel. In other words, they cannot all come from the same chapter.
- Scenes must include all important elements (characters, setting, actions/ dialogue)
- Each scene must have a small description of what is happening
- Each scene must include the chapter and page number

**Ø Paragraphs:**

- Explain why each scene is important to the novel
- Explain what literary devices (theme, setting, imagery, etc.) the author uses in the scene
- Each paragraph should be at least 7 sentences
- Paragraphs should be typed (12 point font, double spaced) or written neatly (skipped lines, black or blue pen)
