



Object: Score points by advancing bases and making runs. (a run is when a player reaches home base)

Method: You must use your knowledge and skill in answering questions in order to help your team win

Hitting The Ball: The class will be divided into two teams.



Each team will have a lineup that determines the order of each team members turn. On the floor is located a baseball diamond consisting of first base, second base, third base, and home base. When a team is up to bat, the player who appears next in the lineup steps up to home base to hit the ball. The ball is in the form of a question thrown to the player by the pitcher (teacher). The batter chooses a question from a possibility of four different levels of difficulty; single, double, triple, or homerun.



Each higher level question being more difficult than the last. The batter will have ten seconds to answer the question correctly. If the batter answers correctly, he/she will advance to the base that matches the question. For example, a single and therefore easier question will move the batter one base, where a triple and therefore more difficult question will move the batter to the third base. If the batter answers the question incorrectly or does not have an answer, the question becomes a flyball giving any player from the opposing team that raises their hand and is called upon, ten seconds to answer correctly to catch the flyball and strike the batter out. If neither the batter or the opposing team member answers correctly, the batter remains at base for another question for a total of two questions before proceeding to the next player in the lineup. In order to prevent one team from dominating the field for too long, after the team that's up to bat accumulates two strikes (instead of three), the field switches to the opposing team.
