Intermediate/ Advanced: For children 8 years old and older who possess the skills to handle a horse at a walk, trot and canter. Each child is assigned their own horse for the week. Arts and crafts and a one hour group riding lesson each day. Session ends with a horse show and a pizza party.

\*If signing up for this week, you must come for one riding lesson, so that you can be evaluated.
