## Scripts:

Two Types of Scripts - script and shooting script.

#### SCRIPT:

- is dialogue continuity.
- · SCRIPT has scenes in order w/ dialogue.
- Generally nothing over 105 pages in a SCRIPT.
- Shorter is better, easier to add content than to subtract it.

## SHORT SCRIPT:

- 6-40 pgs. in continuity
- all the characters.
- some dialogue.
- gives a sense of flow of things.

## SYNOPSIS:

- No dialogue.
- 2-4pgs.

#### TAG LINE:

- 3 phrases Max.
- It's the basic pitch

#### STORY:

- Story is told because it refers to something that can't be said outright.
- At the CENTER there is COMPLEXITY & MYSTERY.
- Uses metaphor to explain the MYSTERY.
- Always about several characters.
- All characters are equally effected by some mystery.

### **CHARACTER & ACTORS**

- Character takes detours and changes as they attempt to express the MYSTERY.
- One reacts to the mystery. Others are implicated by this initial reaction.
- ACTORS are agents of the realization of the narrative. Acts to the MYSTERY, cannot solve immediately.
- As ACTORS attempt to solve mystery, character changes and evolves.
- Characters are defined by action, Actors Act.
- Establish existence of mysteries in character and act in response to this.
- POV of Characters: Can never be inside character's Head.
- Constantly define character from outside...Framing, distance, costuming, etc.
- Actions are always reactions from characters. They do not define the terms of the debate.
- Character is Pathos, to feel emotion in relationship to things.
- Explore how you react but you can never express it outside of actions.

#### **FLOW**

Constantly dealing with eq. of flow. Exists in states. A Succession of States.

- Builds to a FLUX.
- Moments in the flow need to be bracketed and analyzed.
- Want to nail precise moment and nature that exists between the characters.
- Drama of distance.
- ARC is made of lots of small moments.
- Clnema is not one big flow but exists as a series of mini flows.
- A system that constantly evolves.
- Transform the solidity of scene A in B to something else.

#### DRAMA

- That which makes the situation what it is.
- The exchange between forces and people.

### FILM

- made of a series of small films.
- Info is constantly presented and transformed.
- Series of Loops.
- BEGINNING OF FILM: Dark and then film is unfurled before you, you have some reference to the world. You are introduced to a world on which you you have no info what so ever.
  - Preoccupied with giving the rules of the world.
  - Film gives info and then mutates into the story.
- changes from fractal info to emotional info.
- is about the evolution from the finite info you give the viewer at the beginning.
- ALWAYS TRAPPED BY FAMILIARITY.
- Sooner you have all elements together, quicker you can get moving.
- Content and info isn't as important as how it played out in the film.
  - How info is divulged.
  - info is parceled out in a way to tease.
  - Introduce Info in an interesting way.
- Either audience knows as much, more, or less than characters, this animates the story.
- Ask what are elements of story, elements of info, how does the film skate on this info.
