

everend Father Flavian the legendary Rev. Bro. Flavian, former Director of St. Benedict's College, Kotahena passed away in Durate, California, USA on June 11, 2008 at the age 89.

Wilathgamuwa Don Maximus as he was known was the son of a small village cultivator of Welivita. He studied at De La Salle College, Mutwal where he later joined the Novitiate of the De La Salle Brothers and thereafter became a teacher. He was transferred to St. Benedict's College and was in charge of the Commercial

Department before becoming the Director.

He was appointed the Provincial Visitor of the teaching sect administering schools in Sri Lanka, Pakistan and India. He was the first Christian Brother to be included as a delegate in the Ceylon (Sri Lanka) delegation at the United Nations in 1958.

In 1979 he became a Claretian Priest in the United States and was attached to St. Therasita Home Care and Convalescent Centre where he lived for some time before he passed away.

The loss of Father Flavian I am sure will be felt by many of his students all over the world. He was a great Director, a true patriot and a good friend.



A VISIT TO MY COLLEGE - BY AFZAL HAMID

ike some old Bens, I had also not made great efforts to stay in touch closely with the progress of the College, even though St Benedicts College and the characteristics of its motto and teachings often reverberate in me. However, in the year 2000 I was introduced to the St Benedict's College Alumni Association, Canada in Toronto, Ontario by stalwart Old Ben Lucian Alles and that's the point at which I started my interest in the activities of the College through our Association in Canada. "Better late than never"

During my recent visit to Sri Lanka in May 2008, I had the privilege of meeting with Felix Dias whom I admired for his leadership and personality even from my school days. I consider this a once in a life time and rare opportunity of meeting with a great old boy who has devoted his time in the development process of St Benedict's College.

On arriving at St Lucia's square in the company of Felix, nostalgic memories began to roll in. Next was the view of the beautifully laid out garden and statue of St. Benedict. Then we entered the College Quadrangle and at this point onwards, one gets the impression of its heritage over 143 years.

1968 was the year I finished my career at St Benedict's College and to-day I was amazed to personally see the mammoth development that the College has undergone over the past 40 years. Be it improvisation of academic and non academic achievements, construction of new buildings for better and more spacious classrooms, landscaping, upgrade of tech-

nology, and sports and recreation facilities. "Even more plans for development are in the making", said Felix. The recent academic achievements which are considered top notch in Sri Lanka are the results of such dedicated and bold projects undertaken by an able team led by a dynamic Director in Rev. Bro Granville Perera whom I was happy to meet during my visit. There is no doubt that Bro.Granville's era will go down into the history of St Benedict's as the period of "restoration and achievement"

Felix Dias, very patiently took time to explain in detail the progress and future plans for the College. He said that the Alumni Association in Toronto is one of the most active with many an events in the calendar., He also mentioned that he is eager to work closely with our Association and was grateful for our assistance and support over the past 18 years.

We walked through almost every building, passing through the many class rooms especially the computer classes which are now available for students from all grades. The tour included the Primary Department and the newly reconstructed grounds. The College is gifted with very capable administrators, a great team of teachers, a disciplined set of students, an active O B U supported by many loyal Old Bens led by Felix Dias and Ravi Irugalbandara.

I also had the good fortune to meet briefly with another stalwart, Ravi Irugalbandara. Ravi represents the younger generation of old Bens and is a source of strength to Bro. Granville, in assisting him on the day to day needs of the College.

The building with the clock tower requires some maintenance work and therefore some class rooms have been temporarily moved to the Brothers Quarters adjoining the College pavilion. The College grounds look great. It has an additional turf wicket and provision for matting, too. The three storey, Rogus Perera Building is now under construction. The water supply for the grounds comes from a twenty foot deep well designed by an old boy as a cost saving measure. Such is the diligence with which funds are spent. The swimming pool project is in its planning stages and the exact location is not decided as yet. The former bicycle shed will be removed soon for further development.

An interesting feature is the vast greenery on the College premises in spite of the absence of the memorable banyan tree. A new banyan tree planted in the nineties has grown to great heights.

I would like to appeal to all Old Bens to continue your support to make our College the very best. I would like to personally thank the Old Boys Union in Colombo, Donors and supporters, Development Fund Committee, and all Alumni Associations around the world for their untiring efforts in trying to bring back the College to regain its past glory.
