1) **<u>BEHAVIOR</u>**: You are here to learn and I am here to help you do that. **RESPECT** your teacher, your classmates, the building, grounds, properties (eg. furniture and textbooks), and above all, yourself! Make smart decisions and take responsibility for your bad ones.

Please don't bring IPODS, CD players, cell phones, radios, headphones, toys, food, candy, and drinks (other than water) to class. Research has shown they are a distraction in the classroom setting and not conducive to learning!

If the teacher deems it necessary, you could receive a "red card" be sent to the office.

2) **ATTENDANCE**: It is necessary for you to be here each day, on time, for two reasons. Your participation in this class is not only important to your education, but to your classmates as well. You, and your friends, will learn more if you attend. Secondly, you are learning much of the world of work, real-life skills such as attendance and punctuality are learned by students who come to school each day and commit themselves to their time schedules.

If you must be tardy, or have to leave class after it begins, you may use 1 of 4 free hall passes that I will give you. Fill in the blanks with the date and time and give it to me before you leave. I will then give you the class hall pass to take with you. Since my bosses encourage me to limit the number of students in the halls, I encourage you not to use all of your passes. If you must use more than the 4 allotted passes or are tardy more than 4 times, you will be required to make up the time for a 15 minute periods before or after school. You will also be given extra credit for any passes you have left over at the end of the semester! Please be on time.

If you have to be absent, you should have your absence excused by the attendance office then see me. If your absence is excused, you will be allowed 1 class block for each time you're absent to get your makeup work in. For example, if you were gone on Monday, the due date would be Friday. If you were unexpectedly absent on Monday and Wednesday, your makeup work would be due the next Wednesday.

If the make-up work is late, it is immediately worth 1/2 the total possible points. This amounts to a failing grade, but is far better than a "0". For each week the assignment is late, 1/2 the previous week's points will be given. If your absence is unexcused, you will receive a "0" for any work turned in late. This score will allow you to get credit for the work done, but will seriously affect your grade. ALL ASSIGNMENTS must be turned in by the end of the marking period. If a major assignment (test, lab, or homework worth 40 or more points) is not turned in, it will be impossible for me to calculate a fair grade for you and a parent meeting will be called. I know you can complete all assignments so get all work in on time!

If you miss a test, you should take a make-up test within a week of your absence. It is in your best interest to take it as soon as is possible, but if more time is needed, have your parents contact me.

School policy now dictates that you can receive an attendance referral if you have 3 or more unexcused absences and tardies.

60% of your overall grade will be from your average test scores and 40% from homework.

If you are not satisfied with your numerical grade, you are welcome to do extra-credit work. Extra labs, reading, book reports, essays, films, decorations and art work, and reports are all accepted as long as they pertain to the class you are taking. Material must be written in your own words and references are required for your work to be considered for extra credit. Extra credit will only be counted once all regular classroom work is completed. Extra credit can help you if you are a few points from a higher grade and allows a way to reward motivation, ambition, desire, and hard work. It is not recorded on the computer and more information is posted on my website and the flier posted in the room.

One thing that will help you to be successful in this class is your ability to organize. **I** will give you an easy A on a homework assignment if you keep a notebook (or folder, or binder) for this class. It should contain your class notes, quizzes, papers, handouts, and old graded assignments. You should be rewarded for quality, hard work so keep careful track of your grades. Your grade is your responsibility!

Please be aware that 3 or more missing assignments can result in an academic referral.

4) <u>COMMUNICATION:</u> I realize that you are occasionally under a lot of stress and feel like you have the weight of the entire world on your shoulders. If you are having personal problems or are involved in many activities and need time to sort them out, you may see me before or after school. We can sometimes work out a deal on a homework extension. If you feel uncomfortable doing this, have your mother or father contact me.
