

HUNTERS:

THINK YOUR RIFLE IS SAFE FROM SENATOR JOHN KERRY?

THINK AGAIN!

Democrat John Kerry likes to say that he is a hunter and would not do anything to take away the guns of hunters. While telling hunters he is one of them, he voted to reenact the Clinton Gun Ban (3/2/04 Vote 24 Feinstein S.AMDT. 2637 to S. 1805), and he voted for the Kennedy ammunition ban (3/2/04, Vote 28 Kennedy S.AMDT. 2619 to S.1805). Had the Kennedy amendment passed, it would have **banned many hunting rounds including the .30-30 Winchester. Most people with a reasonable knowledge of firearms know that the .223 Remington cartridge is at the low end of rifle calibers in terms of power and range. Think your bolt-action hunting rifle and ammunition is safe from the hands of gun prohibition forces? **If rifles that fire the relatively weak .223 round are considered particularly dangerous “sniper rifles”, what are the implications for the more powerful and accurate hunting rifles chambered for larger calibers like the 30-06? Will your hunting rifle be next?**
