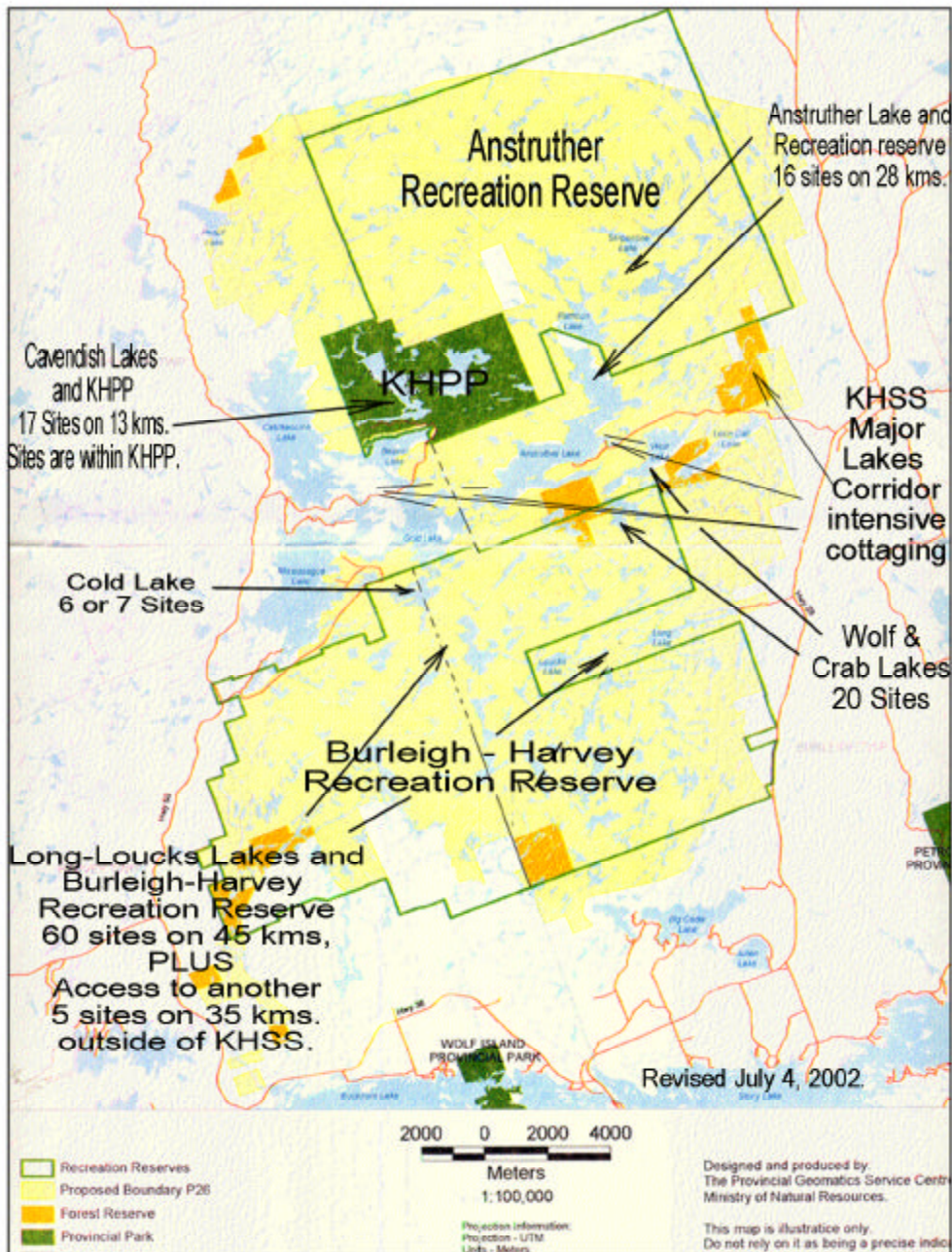


Campsites and Canoe Routes in The Kawartha Highlands Signature Site

The Boundaries for Recreation Reserves established in 1959 by Minister J.W. Spooner are shown overlaying the KHSS area as proposed in July 1999. Ref. [32, Map 5; 26; 28]

There are about 125 campsites in regular use throughout the KHSS, and they are distributed approximately as show below.



Jack van der Meer of Meteek & Co. has pointed out that the canoe routes shown have been developed to capacity, except for the KHPP area.

According to Meteek only the KHPP has the soil depth required to accommodate "drive-in" campsites as usually envisioned.

This report did indicate that there was some capacity to develop "hike-in" campsites that would not interfere with the canoe routes.

The Meteek Report did not mention 20 to 27 sites located on Wolf, Crab and Cold Lakes.
